El blanco de Lela del mar, Spain 12%

Our house white, very drinkable, if anything it goes down far too easily. 5 glass /20 bottle

Darling Cellars, Sauvignon Blanc, 2021, South Africa 12.5%

It's Sav, it's cold, its wet—you'll love it. Dull dull dull did I say that out loud? 5½ /22

Mont Rocher Viognier, NV, France, 13%

Dry, whilst chucking some fruit about the mouth. Varietals beginning with V are now on trend 6/24

Te Quiero Field blend, 2020, Spain, 12%

So its organic, they don't know exactly what the grapes are because the fairies lost the plans? 21

Kalfu Estate "Molu" Chardonnay, 2020 Chile, 13%

Tropical fruits and soft citrus notes. Nice story about starfish. 29

Cuvee Caroline Morin, Picpoul de Pinet, 2020, France 12.5%

Only ever grows around lake Pinet in the south of France, near the sea, drink with seafood. 28

FUNKSTILLE Gruner veltliner, 2020, Austria 12.5%

Trust the innkeeper RADIOSILENCE will not be maintained for long on this little number 30

Castillo de Eneriz Chardonnay, 2020, Spain 12.5%

Smoother than a velvet codpiece. 24

Adega Ponte De Lima Vinho Verde DOC, 2020, Portugal 11.5%

Fresh and floral aromas with a light citrus touch, nice bridge – doubt it gets to Peru. 24

Pierre Marchand & Fils Pouilly Fume, 2020, France 14%

As great NZ Sav is pricing itself out of the market you might as well drink the original. 39

Pink Wines

Pinot Grigio Rose, 2021, Italy. 12%

Its dry, pink and pinot grigio I wouldn't drink it 5½ glass / 22 bottle

Felicette Rose, 2020, France 12.5%

Dedicated to Felicette, the first cat in space. Refreshing and fruity, with delicate red berry fruits flavours of strawberry and raspberry. Puuuurfect with seafood, white meats and creamy sauces. 27

Red Wines

El Tinto De Lela Del Mar, Spain 13%

Soft and rounded, tastes of sunshine (well that's what the bottle says) 5 glass / 20 bottle

Los Espinos Merlot, 2020, Chile 13.5%

Stunning wine from a small producer, packed with fruit. 5.75/22½

Man Meets Mountain Malbec, Argentina, 14%

Bright, bold & lush with black cherry and plum notes. Maria will fight you for the last bottle. 6.20/24½

Murphy Vineyard Big Rivers Shiraz, 2020, Australia 14.5%

Great with red meat, stews or cheese 6.2/24½

Glenelly Estate Cabernet Franc, 2017, South Africa, 14%

Deep, rich, bright colour. Aromas of dried thyme, oregano and Cape Fynbos (whatever that is) with black cherry and graphite in the background. It's delicious, we could drink it by the bucket. 30

Luis Cañas Rioja Reserva, 2015, Spain, 14.5%

A truly legendary wine from a legendary producer, could well blow your socks off. 39

Calusari Pinot Noir NV Romania 12.5%

If this were from Burgundy you'd not get change out of a nifty, very cherry, touch of tobacco! 27½

Fuedo Antico 'Altopiano' Montepulciano d'Abruzzo, 2020, Italy. 13%

At the forefront of the most advanced project for sustainability in Italy 24

Neropasso Originale Rosso Corvinone – Corvina – Cabernet, 2020, Italy, 13.5%

Like a mini Amarone. Air-dried grapes concentrate the flavours and allow the sugar content to rise. 29

Capel Vale Debut Cabernet – Merlot, 2019, Western Australia, 14%

Great with any food, ballsy enough for red meat dishes or award-winning sausage. Nice duck on the label. 30

Fizzy Wine

Biscardo Millesimato Prosecco, 2020, Italy, 11.5%

A second bottle is probably inevitable. 5½ glass / 31 bottle

Champagne Pierre Mignon Premier Cru Grande Reserve Brut, NV, France 12%

Tiny producer making wonderful, handcrafted Champagne 44

Biscardo Millesimato Vintage Prosecco, Rose, Italy, 11.5%

This is elegant, smooth and velvety on the palate with a harmonious dry finish. A delicious aperitif. 35
